THE LORD'S DAY AT HOME

If you are housebound or self-isolating at this time, please use these readings to unite yourself with the worship of the Universal Church, and your own Parish, this Sunday. If alone, read or say these readings quietly to yourself. If with another, or in a family, someone should read the Gospel, and others respond. It might be suitable to find a special, quiet place at home for your Sunday prayers

Gospel Reading

John 10:11-18

Jesus said: 'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock, and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'

Reflection

For about four hundred years the early Church was somewhat shy about depicting the crucifixion of Jesus: far more common was showing him as the Good Shepherd – the title he claims for himself in today's Gospel. There are two sides to this image: what we see in Jesus, and what we see in ourselves! Jesus as the Good Shepherd is full of selfless love for every single sheep, unlike a hired hand, and will even sacrifice his life for the sake of the flock. Jesus as the Good Shepherd was willing to face the wolf that was his persecutors, to lay down his life for our sake. Jesus as the Good Shepherd is the one who will lead us, find us when lost, heal us when hurt, and guide us through the narrow gate that leads to eternal pastures. This is all wonderful, but for it to "work" there is the other side: we must acknowledge that we are his sheep! We belong to him, and we will follow his lead, and allow him to guide us. We admit that sometimes we are silly and selfish, and will get lost, so that he has to come looking for us. We accept that he will protect us by laying down his life, so that we can be free. In our culture to be "sheepish" is not seen as a good thing; today, however, let us be proud to be sheep of His flock, with the risen Good Shepherd guiding us to eternal green pastures!
