Mustard Seeds

7 7 Simple Suggestions for a Successful Lent

Spiritual practices will aid your Lenten journey for a fruitful 40 days.

- 1. **Read the Bible.** "God's love letter will make you feel like you could not only run but win the Marathon," In the Bible, we learn about God's family, what breaks his heart, what makes him happy, and how we can stay in relationship with him. ... Once you start reading Scripture, you won't be able to stop. Tip: Begin with the New Testament and events leading to and including Holy Week and the Passion.
- 2. Attend Mass as much as you can. Go to Mass at least an extra day of the week besides Sundays. Friday would be a good day, considering Jesus' journey to Good Friday. Also offer up Masses for people in need as well as for deceased or sick loved ones. Stay in church for a few minutes after Mass and pray.
- 3. **Go to Eucharistic Adoration**. Spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament in the presence of the Lord. The Lord is waiting for you to bring your needs and the needs of your families.
- 4. Pray the Rosary and the Stations of the Cross. Turn off the music or podcast on your car radio and instead pray the Rosary or the Stations of the Cross, or talk to God on your journey. If possible, also pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet during the daily three o'clock hour. Another suggestion: Pray a Rosary for a couple you know who is going through a difficult time in their marriage, or pray a Rosary in thanksgiving for the blessings of your married life.
- 5. Put Together a List of Those to Pray for. Each day, say a prayer for them. Is there one in particular whom you think of right away? Adopt that person in prayer this Lenten season. As you make an act of self-denial, pray: 'Oh Jesus, I do this act out of love for you and for the conversion of [Name]'s soul. Pray for our new bishop, asking God to inspire him, in the way he governs, teaches, preaches and sanctifies, along with prayers for your Parish and priests who have blessed your life and heard your confessions. Also pray for those you encounter throughout your day.
- 6. **Delve into Spiritual Reading.** In addition to Scripture, pick up some spiritual writing. Read Church teachings about the sacraments. Begin with the Eucharist to really help you meet Jesus at an up-close personal level.
- 7. Make Simple Sacrifices. Children can also make a spiritually profitable Lenten season. We can offer our daily sacrifices as an act of love. Wishing you a blessed Lent!


Lenten Retreat
