

### Pope Leo XIV Explains the Mission of Peter

As would be expected, during the homily at his inaugural mass (May 18th, 2025), Pope Leo XIV chose to preach on the mission of St. Peter and his successors, the The message popes. from the Holy Father gives us a glimpse into his mind and heart regarding how understands what God is asking him to do as the Bishop of Rome. In his homily, he stated there are two dimensions to the mission of the pope:



love and unity. These two dimensions were given to Peter by Jesus himself. The Holy Father used the Gospel passage about the miraculous catch of fish during the first Easter season (John 21). In this moment, Peter leads the apostles in gathering together a large number of fish with their nets. Today, as back then, the Pope is to be a "fisher" of humanity, as was Christ. The pope says:"After the resurrection, it is up to them to carry on this mission, to cast their nets again and again, to bring the hope of the Gospel into the "waters" of the world, to sail the seas of life so that all may experience God's embrace." Pope Leo XIV wants to unite the Church in a visible unity, which will be a light to the whole world. This is one dimension of the papacy: to unite. And the second dimension comes into play when we ask: How can Peter carry out this task? How does the Holy Father unite the world? Pope Leo gives us an answer in that Jesus asks Peter very clearly if he has love. He says that "When Jesus asks Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" (Jn 21:16), he is referring to the love of the Father. It is as if Jesus said to him, "Only if you have known and experienced this love of God, which never fails, will you be able to feed my lambs. Only in the love of God the Father will you be able to love your brothers and sisters with that same 'more', that is, by offering your life for your brothers and sisters." The Pope says that Peter, and all popes, are tasked with "loving more" and giving their lives for the flock.

"Never, ever settle for anything less than the spiritual and moral grandeur that the grace of God makes possible in your lives. Never settle for less than that. You will fail, as we all do; but that is no reason to lower the bar of expectation. Get up, dust yourself off, seek forgiveness and reconciliation, and try again. But never, ever settle for anything less than the spiritual and moral greatness that is available to you, and of which you are capable by God's grace. Don't ever settle for less than that." [George Weigel]

#### MEMORIAL OF ST CHARLES LWANGA AND COMPANIONS ON TUESDAY

One of 22 Ugandan martyrs, Charles Lwanga is the patron of youth and Catholic action in most of tropical Africa. He protected his fellow pages, aged 13 to 30, from the sexual demands of the Bagandan ruler, Mwanga, and encouraged and instructed them in the Catholic faith during their imprisonment for refusing the ruler's demands. On the night of Mukaso's martyrdom for encouraging the African youths to resist Mwanga, Charles requested and received baptism. Imprisoned with his friends, Charles' courage and belief in God inspired them to remain chaste and faithful. For his own unwillingness to submit to the immoral acts and his efforts to safeguard the faith of his friends, Charles was burned to death at Namugongo on June 3, 1886, by Mwanga's order.



#### ■ "Go and make disciples of all nations"

As we come to the end of our Easter season, those final words of Christ should be the words that ring in our ears every day. They are a command that the Lord made to his disciples before he ascended to his heavenly Father, and they are a command he makes to us daily... So how, in the Church in Scotland, must we respond to that command? First of all, we do so in our own communities, our homes, our workplaces. The best way for someone to encounter Christ is through a person of faith. That means you. .. And we proclaim the Good News collectively, through our parishes, our dioceses, and as members of the Catholic Church spread throughout the world. Just look at how people engaged with us after the death of Pope Francis and at the election of Pope Leo. There was a depth of feeling that stretched beyond the Church and was more than mere curiosity. It was perhaps a good reminder that if we as a Church can capture people's imagination, we can also reach out to their souls with our message of Hope, the Hope that is rooted in the risen Christ... We must use all the means available to reach out to them. It is not good enough to wait for our brothers and sisters to come to us. We must do all we can to go to them. On the day of his election, Pope Leo said this from the balcony of St Peter's: "Together, we must look for ways to be a missionary Church, a Church that builds bridges and encourages dialogue, a Church ever open to welcoming, like this Square with its open arms, all those who are in need of our charity, our presence, our readiness to dialogue and our love". On this Communications Sunday, let us renew our commitment to open our arms to others so that they may the receive the welcome offered by the risen Christ. 
#### ■Youth Evenings are a-comin' - watch this Space
