

The Power of the Cross



Today, we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, recognising the cross as the very instrument of our salvation. Once an instrument of torture, designed to degrade the worst of criminals in Roman times, it has become the life-giving tree and enduring symbol of our faith. This day also commemorates the historical event of the discovery of the True Cross by Saint Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine. According to tradition, first mentioned by Saint Cyril of Jerusalem in 348 AD, Saint Helena, inspired by divine guidance, travelled to Jerusalem in 326 AD to excavate the Holy Sepulchre and locate the Cross on which Jesus died. She unearthed three crosses. One tradition holds that the inscription "Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum" (Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews) remained attached to the True Cross. Another tradition suggests that the True Cross was identified when a dead youth, being carried past on a stretcher, was miraculously brought back to life after each of the three crosses was laid over him in turn—the third cross being the one that restored him to life. In honour of this sacred discovery, Constantine ordered the construction of two churches at the sites of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary. These churches were dedicated on September 13 and 14, 335 AD, and shortly thereafter, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross began to be celebrated on the latter date. The feast gradually spread from Jerusalem to other churches, becoming a universal celebration by the year 720 AD. The original structure, known for its grandeur, underwent various modifications over the centuries, particularly after it was damaged by Persian forces in 614 AD and later destroyed by the Fatimid Caliph Al-Hakim in 1009 AD.

OUR LADY OF SORROWS ON MONDAY

John's account of Jesus' death is highly symbolic. When Jesus gives the beloved disciple to Mary, we are invited to appreciate Mary's role in the Church: She symbolises the Church; the disciple represents all believers. As Mary mothered Jesus, she is now mother to all his followers. Furthermore, as Jesus died, he handed over his Spirit. Mary and the Spirit cooperate in begetting new children of God—almost an echo of Luke's account of Jesus' conception. Christians can trust that they will continue to experience the caring presence of Mary and Jesus' Spirit throughout their lives and throughout history.

■ Pilgrimage of Hope Walk - this Sunday

The parishes of North Ayrshire (St Mary's Deanery) will be joined by people from across the Diocese for our event marking 2025 as a Jubilee under the theme "Pilgrims of Hope". On Sunday 14th Sept - the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross - we will walk from St John's Church Stevenston to St Peter's Ardrossan on a 'Pilgrims of Hope' walk and then have a picnic for individuals, groups & families on the grass directly in front of St Peter's (near the HMS Dasher memorial). Those unable to walk the whole distance can chose to walk from St Mary's Saltcoats, or even just meet the 'Pilgrims' at St Peter's. After the picnic we will gather in St Peter's Church for a short service and celebration. Should the weather prove too poor to picnic outside we will 'picnic' in St Peter's Hall instead. ■ Pope Leo to politicians: be true to Christ and have the courage to suffer for his name

This week, MSPs returned to the Scottish Parliament, fresh from their summer recess and ready for another round of debate, argument, scrutiny and lawmaking, including further consideration of a bill that could legalise assisted suicide in Scotland. The return of elected representatives to Holyrood helpfully coincides

with a recent audience Pope Leo held with a group of politicians, during which he urged all Catholic politicians to remain faithful to Christ and to have the courage to suffer for his name. To do this, the Pope suggested politicians should deepen their knowledge of the Church's social doctrine that Jesus taught and put this at the centre of the exercise of their duties, including the drafting of laws. Catholics involved in political life are invited to base their political activity on the fundamental principle of a correct understanding of the human person. This is the understanding that every human person is created in God's image, endowed with dignity and inalienable rights, and also duties. It is recognising that the human person is both the foundation and goal of society, and thus it is the principal task of every society to defend and foster human life and human dignity in its laws and institutions... Parliamentarians must protect religious freedom, develop an economy that is at the service of the human person and of the common good, with respect for social justice, the principles of human solidarity and subsidiarity, and work for peace and the absolute rejection of violence and terrorism. Moreover, Catholic parliamentarians are called to be faithful to the Church's preferential option for the poor, which is the Church's particular concern for those most in need. The Pope acknowledged that being openly Christian in today's politics is "not easy", especially in the West where "Christ and his Church are marginalised, often ignored, sometimes ridiculed." He also acknowledged the pressures of "party instructions" and "ideological colonisations" to which politicians are subjected. The Pope concluded his address, saying that politicians needed to have the courage to sometimes say "no, I can't", when the truth is at stake. Here, says the Pope, only union with Christ crucified "will give you the courage to suffer for his name."
